




2017 Coos County Communicable Disease Cases

Coos Health & Wellness Public Health program works to prevent the emergence and spread of communicable diseases such as Salmonella, Influenza, Hepatitis, HIV, and Tuberculosis. This includes collecting and analyzing disease reports, studying risk factors, protecting exposed individuals and families, developing guidelines for disease prevention and control, and planning and responding to public health emergencies involving communicable diseases.

In 2017, our clinic staff received 1,121 communicable disease reports. After investigation, 446 of these were confirmed cases of disease. Some of the most common reports received were Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Hepatitis C, and Salmonella.
