Coos County Recent reduction in Risk Level to High Risk Guidelines is a milestone in our progress to getting our County open. We are optimistic that if we all work together we can reduce this risk level even further.

Many of us are excited to be able to once again go to local restaurants and bars with our friends. Please remember that the following restrictions are still in place.

Mask requirements are still in effect. If you are with people from outside your household you must wear your mask unless you are eating or drinking. This means while ordering at the drive through, talking to fellow employees, or even while singing karaoke, masks are required. For counties in the High Risk level the indoor entertainment capacity limit is: maximum 25% occupancy or 50 people total, whichever is smaller.
